

2017 Bennett Valley Cardiac Hill Syrah 94-96 Points Jeb Dunnuck

The 2017 vintage marks the inaugural release of Cardiac Hill Syrah from the Jemrose Vineyard. Although we have worked with this vineyard for a couple of seasons, it was not until 2017 that we were familiar enough with the vineyard for it to warrant its own bottling. We like to think of 2017 as the first vintage in five that was not a drought year. The winter season brought a bevy of much needed precipitation and pushed budbreak, flowering, and veraison a

week or so later than the previous few years. Temperatures stayed moderate until record breaking heat struck Sonoma over Labor Day weekend. Vigilant growers and winemakers were prepared for the unprecedented temperatures and picked early in the vineyards that were ready. Vintages like 2017 demonstrate why it's important that winemaking strategy start in the vineyard.

The 2017 Cardiac Hill Syrah is not for the faint of heart. It's heady, brooding, and beautifully balanced. A bouquet of iron filings, fruit preserves, molten chocolate cake, mint, and dusty loam earth jumps from the glass. The mid-palate has big gripping tannin and savory sweet notes of plum, pipe tobacco, and soy sauce. Drink now through 2030.

Vineyard Notes:

Location

Tucked into Jemrose Vineyard, the small Cardiac Hill vineyard block earned its name because of the steep, rocky, north-facing slope it is planted to. The Estrella River selection of Syrah and the limited rocky soils yields some of the smallest and most flavorful Syrah fruit around.
